#### 2023-24 ACADEMIC YEAR

With the addition of our 2023-24 class, we have now supported over 200 Graduate Fellows and awarded over \$4 million in grants - two exciting program milestones!

Our **20** current program Advisers teaching at universities across the country nominated our <u>2023-24 Graduate Fellows</u> for their demonstrated leadership potential as well as their commitment to public service, outstanding intellectual ability, moral character, academic achievements and civic contributions.

Over **\$212,000** was awarded to these **14** scholars with areas of focus including intelligence, global policy, international affairs, law, defense and strategic studies, public policy, statecraft, politics, public administration and more.

### 2023 NETWORK ACTIVITES

#### **ALUMNI LEADERSHIP COUNCIL**

Our network's leadership body is comprised of engaged alumni who help shape the future development of the Graduate Fellowship Network.

This year's Council assisted Foundation staff in developing 2023 event programming, selecting the Alumni of the Year Awardee, providing important feedback on program initiatives and much more. They also delivered a briefing to network members at the 2023 Conference, pictured below.

#### **2023 SPRING RETREAT**

In May 2023, network members gathered in Annapolis, Maryland for a <u>daylong retreat</u> including opportunities for targeted networking among Fellows and program Advisers, remarks from the Director of the Stockdale Center for Ethical Leadership, an alumni panel, a foreign policy discussion with a program Adviser, a tour of the U.S. Naval Academy and a closing dinner in the historic downtown.

#### **NETWORK CONNECT**

Through our mentorship initiative, we made 11 Fellow-to-Fellow mentor connections in 2023. We are delighted that feedback from these matches has been terrific!

#### **OTHER EVENTS AND ACTIVITIES**

Fellows and Advisers collaborate yearround in co-authoring articles, inviting each other as speakers, and sharing jobs, professional opportunities and resources, in addition to updating one another on career advancements through our monthly communications and bi-annual newsletter.

We also hosted 3 book discussions - one on a Fellow-authored book on today's political divide, another on an Adviser-authored book on President Reagan's foreign policy and the third in partnership with the Andrew W. Marshall Foundation on net assessment.



## **2023 ANNUAL CONFERENCE**

SEPTEMBER 21-22 - WASHINGTON, D.C.

At our program's 11th annual flagship gathering, events showcased the professional achievements of long-time network members, as well as offered opportunities for Fellows and Advisers to make valuable connections while discussing important policy topics.

External speakers included: Thom Shanker, former New York Times correspondent, on his recent book. The Age of Danger (pictured below); Dr. Nadia Schadlow of the Hudson Institute on strategy and practice in national security; Alex Vatanka of The Middle East Institute on Iranian policy; and Daniel Fata of Fata Advisory LLC on current U.S. foreign policy challenges.



Experienced Fellows and Advisers also led Network Roundtables on subjects of their expertise: Inside the Intelligence Community; Pursuing Truth in Academia - A New Model; The Future of Nuclear Deterrence and U.S. Alliances; and Federal Career Pathways; in addition to a panel of Fellows who offered advice from their various public service paths (pictured at top right.)

## CAMCA FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM



### 2023 FELLOWSHIP STATS

With the addition of our <u>two 2023 Fellowship cohorts</u>, we have now supported 277 Fellows throughout 27 Fellowship sessions in partnership with the <u>Central Asia-Caucasus Institute</u> at the American Foreign Policy Council.

The 2023 Fellows participated in over **150** meetings in Washington, D.C. and dozens more throughout their travels in **6** cities where they learned about governance and economic development at the local level: Chicago, Illinois (pictured above); Dallas, Texas; South Bend, Indiana; Kalamazoo, Michigan; Salt Lake City, Utah; and Los Angeles, California.

#### 2023 FELLOWS

The 2023 Fellows represented some of the best and brightest of a new generation across the **CAMCA (Central Asia-Mongolia-Caucasus-Afghanistan)** region: including the nations of Afghanistan, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Georgia, Kazakhstan, the Kyrgyz Republic, Mongolia, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan and Uzbekistan. **2023 Fellows held positions such as**:

#### **CAMCA NETWORK**

The CAMCA Fellowship's alumni group, the <u>CAMCA Network</u>, organizes year-round network events and activities, in addition to developing joint projects focused on furthering regional cooperation. The 270+ member group is led by the **CAMCA**Network Board, comprised of a representative from each of the 10 countries.



#### **NETWORK ACTIVITIES**

In 2023, the Board met on a monthly basis to further ongoing member activities as well as to contribute to content development and planning for the annual CAMCA Regional Forum (more on page 9.)

The network's Working Groups - which develop and facilitate initiatives in the following sectors: business, education, women's empowerment, think tanks and media - also organized meetings and discussed regional opportunities within their fields.

The network's annual in-person convening took place alongside the events of the CAMCA Forum in Almaty. The daylong meeting included briefings by the CAMCA Network Board, interactive team-building exercises (pictured above), network award presentations, targeted networking and discussion sessions among the various Working Groups.



## **2023 CAMCA REGIONAL FORUM**

JUNE 15-16 - ALMATY, KAZAKHSTAN



As a part of our efforts to encourage regional cooperation across the CAMCA region and to support our CAMCA Fellowship's alumni network, the Foundation annually organizes the **CAMCA Regional Forum** in partnership with the Central Asia-Caucasus Institute and the CAMCA Network.

The <u>2023 CAMCA Regional Forum</u> was held in **Almaty, Kazakhstan** over June 15th-16th, convening over **180 attendees** from **15 countries** including **60+ speakers** to discuss key regional issues and developments surrounding the 2023 Forum theme, "**Uniting CAMCA: Progress and Possibilities.**"

Keynote speakers included: *Askar Shakirov*, Chairman of the Committee on International Affairs, Defence and Security of the Senate of the Parliament of Kazakhstan; *Hernando de Soto*, renowned economist and President of the Institute for Liberty and Democracy in Peru; *Senator Sodyq Safoev*, First Deputy Chairman of the Senate of Oliy Majilis of the Republic of Uzbekistan; and *Renat Bekturov*, Governor of the Astana International Financial Centre.

Forum sessions featured topics such as: regional coordination; geopolitics; regional media; religion and state; transportation corridors; think tank synergy; digital transformation; transformative education; entrepreneurship; women's empowerment; and regional investment opportunities and impediments.
