2014 CAMCA Regional Forum, Astana, Kazakhstan June 20-22, 2014

The Rumsfeld Foundation hosted the 2014 CAMCA (Central Asia-Mongolia-Caucasus-Afghanistan) Regional Forum in Astana, Kazakhstan from June 20-22, 2014. The Forum was organized in cooperation with the Central Asia-Caucasus Institute at Johns Hopkins University's School of Advanced International Studies and the alumni of the Rumsfeld Fellowship Program.

The CAMCA Regional Forum is dedicated to promoting region-wide discussions on advancing economic growth and development in the heart of Eurasia (Afghanistan, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Georgia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Mongolia, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, and Uzbekistan) to fulfill the individual and regional potential of these countries. It promotes this goal by fostering dialogue and interaction among rising young leaders from all sectors of life in the 10 countries, as well as international stakeholders.



The CAMCA Regional Forum has evolved out of the Rumsfeld Fellowship Program at the Central Asia-Caucasus Institute, which has been bringing rising young leaders from the region to Washington, D.C. since 2008. As of July 2014, over 100 professionals have completed the Fellowship.

Over 50 alumni of the Fellowship Program, with representatives from all 12 fellowship classes, met in Astana to participate in the 2014 CAMCA Regional Forum. Also in attendance were representatives of the Rumsfeld Foundation and the Central Asia-Caucasus Institute, as well as several business leaders, government officials, regional experts and other professionals.

Additional assistance for the Forum activities was provided by partners including the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Kazakhstan and the Nazarbayev Center.

The Forum began on June 20th as participants were welcomed with an opening reception held at the Rixos President Hotel Gardens.

The following day, introductory remarks were provided by Dr. Steve Cambone, Rumsfeld Foundation Board Member, Dr. S. Frederick Starr, Chairman of the Central Asia-Caucasus Institute, Mr. Erzhan Ashikbayev, Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs of Kazakhstan, and Mr. Timur Shaimergenov, Deputy Director of the Nazarbayev Center.



After the opening remarks, Ms. Madina Abylkassymova, Vice-Minister of Economy and Budget Planning of Kazakhstan, made a presentation and answered questions on the "Kazakhstan 2050" Strategy."



The remainder of the Forum consisted of four panels focused on topics including "Macro-economic Stability and Foreign Direct Investments Along the New Transportation Corridors," "Models of Economic Cooperation: From European Union to Eurasian Union and Beyond," "Bridging Asia and Europe: Transportation and Transit Potential of CAMCA," and

and National Security in the CAMCA Region."

Panelists included numerous alumni of the Rumsfeld Fellowship Program as well as representatives from the European Bank of Reconstruction and Development (EBRD), the Ministry of Industry and New Technologies of Kazakhstan, the Public Policy Institute of the Nur Otan Party in Kazakhstan, Kyrgyz Concept Ltd., and McKinsey & Company.

Along with the speakers and panel sessions, Forum participants were treated to an afternoon tour of the capital city with visits to the Astana Opera House, Bayterek Tower, Independence Palace and Nazarbayev University. In addition, participants continued their discussions over Forum dinners held at a number of fine Astana restaurants.



The 2014 CAMCA Regional Forum concluded on June 22nd after two days of presentations and discussions. The next CAMCA Regional Forum will be held in June 2015.
