

The Spring 2017 Group of Rumsfeld Fellows Completes Program in Washington, D.C.

The Spring 2017 group of Fellows from Central Asia, the Caucasus, Afghanistan and Mongolia completed a six-week program of high-level meetings and research in Washington, D.C. from April 4 to May 12, 2017.
