CAMCA REGIONAL FORUM

The CAMCA (Central Asia-Mongolia-Caucasus-Afghanistan) Regional Forum is a premier non-political and non-partisan convening established to promote region-wide discussions on means of advancing economic growth and social development in Greater Central Asia (Afghanistan, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Georgia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Mongolia, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan and Uzbekistan).

It promotes this goal by fostering dialogue and interaction among top professionals from all sectors in the 10 countries of the region, as well as with international leaders and stakeholders.

The Forum organizers believe that expanded communication and collaboration among talented professionals from a range of fields can significantly contribute to economic, political and social development on both a national and regional basis.

The CAMCA Regional Forum was established in 2014 through collaborative efforts of the Rumsfeld Foundation, Central Asia-Caucasus Institute and the CAMCA Network.





BAKU: CITY OF FIRE AND WIND


Welcome to Baku, the capital of Azerbaijan and the largest urban center of the Caspian region in both size and population. The bustling city of Baku is home to roughly 2.5 million people, with nearly one million more dwelling in the broader Absheron peninsula.



While the first documented reference to Baku in historical sources dates back to the 8th century, archeological findings suggest that the area has been inhabited since the times of the Stone Age. Baku was the capital city of the people of the Shirvan Kingdom in the Middle Ages until the Kingdom's fall in the 17th century, at which time the city became a trade outpost and fishing town. It wasn't until the mid-19th century that the city would be revitalized by the oil boom, bringing industrialization and urbanization to the forefront of the city's landscape. While oil from Baku had been sought from across the region for thousands of years, this wave of industrialization contributed to its new international reputation as explorers, bankers, industrialists and engineers from all over the world flocked to the city in hope of benefitting from opportunities created by the growing oil industry.

The burgeoning number of impressive and striking buildings, featuring fine examples of European Renaissance and late Baroque styles neighboring along ancient architectural pieces, brought an exquisite

new charm to the emerging city. In addition, due to increased immigration from across the region, Baku continued to develop into a truly international city open to embracing and celebrating religious tolerance and cultural diversity. By 1870, Baku's population had risen sharply from about 20,000 to more than 250,000 residents. After regaining its independence in the early 1990's, the city experienced yet another wave of rapid development due to its second major oil boom. This boom brought numerous new institutions of business and transport, paving the way for Baku to become the modern metropolis that it is today. At present, Baku boasts a globally acclaimed 5-star international airport, a new sea port with the potential to revolutionize the flow of trade and transit across the Caspian Sea, as well as numerous important transport and infrastructure projects underway that will help continue to position the city as a leading regional transit hub.



Baku's tourism and entertainment continues to evolve and grow as visitors flock to one of the world's largest seaside city boulevards, spanning 12 kilometers and filled with hundreds of cafes and restaurants, an aquatic center, playgrounds and the famous Crystal Concert Hall (the site of the recent Eurovision Song Contest). The city has also continued to play host to a number of large-scale international forums and high-level events attracting leading business professionals and government officials from around the world.

Moreover, after hosting the 2016 Formula One Azerbaijan Grand Prix, branded by international media as an "iconic" city circuit, Baku remains a new hub for European sports competition alongside a surge of sporting and athletics development in the capital. Looking ahead, Baku will host major football events including several games of the upcoming EURO 2020, which will be held at the new Olympic Stadium, able to accommodate 80,000 fans. The city has also hosted the Eurovision and European Games, as well as the Islamic Solidarity Games, and is currently bidding for a chance to host the World Expo 2025.

Baku's skyline displays a beautiful and actively developing cityscape of architectural wonders. One of the city's more famous buildings, the Heydar Aliyev Center designed by the late architect Zaha Hadid, is located at the gates to the historical district and is distinguished by its ultra-modern appearance and flowing white design.



The Flame Towers, a trio of skyscrapers located at the top of the Baku Bay area, have become iconic features of the city. Additionally, the “Baku White City” project leads the largest urban development and rehabilitation construction in the region, with residential and commercial space implemented with state-of-the-art urban and architectural planning techniques.

For history buffs, visiting the Old City of Baku, an open-space historical museum, is a must. Included by UNESCO on the List of World Heritage, the Icheri Sheher (“Inner City”) is a medieval town with a number of well-preserved monuments ranging from the 5th to the 16th century. Unique historic sites include the Maiden Tower (5th century), Saint Bartholomew’s Church (5th century), an ancient mosque from the 11th century, the Shirvanshah Palace (15th century) and authentic 16th century restaurants called Karavansarays that serve traditional tea and food.

In addition to its rich historical landscape, Baku's cultural scene is active and thriving. With groundbreaking achievements such as creating the first opera and ballet in the Muslim Orient, there are vibrant theaters and opera houses featuring distinguished local and international performances. The city regularly hosts an international jazz festival and is home to dozens of art galleries, museums and music halls. Renowned for its local flavorful food culture, Baku is also a city of international cuisine for any taste from Thai to Brazilian. Live music halls and bars create an energetic and buzzing atmosphere, which Lonely Planet recently ranked among the top-10 best nightlife scenes on the global scale. Beyond Baku's thriving cityscape is its natural beauty, with the warm sea and sandy beaches stretching along the coastline, a mere 20-minute trip from the city's center. The people of Baku proudly invite you to experience all their city has to offer - its ancient history and traditions, its multicultural synergy, its architectural splendors and its diverse heritage - all of which have formed the unique and striking city of Baku.




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
