Stephanie was a member of the Foundation's first Fellowship cohort during the 2009-2010 academic year, during which she pursued a Master's degree in Defense and Strategic Studies at Missouri State University. Stephanie was nominated as the 2022 Alumni of the Year for her leadership, public service and outstanding contributions to Operation Allies Welcome (OAW), assisting Afghan refugees entering the United States. In addition to our conference and retreat, we hosted 4 additional events throughout 2022 on topics ranging from publishing advice to future foreign policy challenges, featuring experienced public servants like Secretary Condoleezza Rice and Dr. Kori Schake, as well as our own talented Fellows and Advisers.

### **NETWORK ACTIVITY**

Current Fellows, alumni and Advisers collaborate year-round in numerous ways like co-authoring articles, featuring one another in events as speakers, and sharing jobs, professional opportunities and other resources, in addition to keeping their colleagues up to date on career advancements through our monthly updates and bi-annual newsletter.

Among the year's network activity was the launch of a new program initiative, called Network Connect. Network Connect facilitates targeted Fellow-to-Fellow professional mentorship relationships among our alumni. ### **CAMCA NETWORK**

The CAMCA Fellowship's alumni group, the <u>CAMCA Network</u>, works closely together year-round to coordinate network events and activities as well as to share ideas and opportunities - all with the mission of furthering regional cooperation across their countries.



Our alumni serve in notable positions across sectors from academia, government and think tanks to non-profits and business in leadership roles as CEOs, Founders, Executive Directors, Ministers, Deputy Ministers, Ambassadors, Chairpersons, Parliament members and beyond...

The network also has a leadership body that was established in 2019, the <u>CAMCA Network Board</u>, comprised of representatives from each of the 10 countries, that works to spearhead initiatives on behalf of the entire network.

#### 2022 NETWORK ACTIVITY

In addition to alumni working together on joint projects and business ventures, interviewing one another for podcasts, collaborating on cross-border initiatives and beyond, a sample of network activity in 2022 included:

- A new Chair of the CAMCA Network Board was elected.
- The Board met 14 times to discuss initiatives and to help plan the 2022 CAMCA Regional Forum.
- In advance of the CAMCA Forum's official events in D.C., the Board organized and led an afternoon of productive networking activities for all alumni attending the Forum. (Pictured at right)
- The Board issued a network-wide survey to collect feedback in order to develop an updated strategy for the network's growth and activities in 2023.
- The network's 6 sector-based Working Groups met many times to work on specific initiatives.



#### 2022 CAMCA REGIONAL FORUM



As a part of our efforts to promote regional cooperation across the CAMCA region and to support our Fellowship's alumni network, the Foundation annually hosts the CAMCA Regional Forum in partnership with the Central Asia-Caucasus Institute and the CAMCA Network.

Over June 15<sup>th</sup>-16<sup>th</sup> we held the **2022 CAMCA Regional Forum** convening over **200 attendees** from **17** countries including **60+ speakers** to discuss key regional issues and developments surrounding this year's Forum theme, "**New Geopolitics and Geoeconomics in CAMCA**." While typically held in the CAMCA region, due to the ongoing complications with the pandemic, the 2022 Forum was held in Washington, D.C.
